2	<b>Minutes from previous meeting</b> – agreed subject to amending the list of apologies where two names were duplicated. Action – LT to amend.	<b>LT</b>
3	<b>Update on Sustainable &amp; Accessible Transport Priority</b> – Viv Evans (VE) reminded the group that the Management Board had agreed to set up a new priority partnership that would focus on the Sustainable and Accessible Transport priorities within the Hart Sustainable Community Strategy (SCS). To date, Hampshire County Council had provided updates on the priorities via the HAT Co-ordinator for Hart.  VE had met with Hampshire County Council to discuss how the partnership meetings could work but county had advised that they would be unable to provide a resource to chair and support the meetings although they would make relevant officers available to attend the meetings as required by future agenda items.  It was now necessary to consider who should be a member of the new partnership, who would Chair the meetings and how support for the partnership would be delivered. Hart District Association of Parish and Town Councils (HDAPTC) had identified Chris Cornwell from Hart	
4	<b>Community Engagement Strategy</b> – Cllr Crookes (KC) detailed the background for the strategy and advised the meeting that Cllr John Kennett had been established as the Portfolio Holder for Public & Business Engagement with a view to engaging with the diverse communities within Hart district.  A sub-group of the LSP had been working on preparing the strategy, the Overview & Scrutiny Panel at Hart had reviewed the document and it was intended that the final strategy would be referred to the Hart Cabinet in February.  Cl Jackson had worked with the sub-group and stressed the importance of including other partners' approaches within the final document. KC confirmed that it was important not to duplicate and that the partnership needs to hear all the voices of the community. Bill Flood advised on what Sentinel had been working on and that it would be useful for all partners to share lessons and work together.	

	<p>Cllr Jenny Radley asked that there be a reference to the harder to reach groups within the document and welcomed the opportunity to further develop this work. Tim Colman commented that there was no reference to the business community. Any comments on the strategy to be fed back to VE or LT.</p>	
5	<p><b>Safer Hart Community Safety Partnership – Strategic Assessment of Crime &amp; Disorder</b> – delivered within CSP update at item 6.</p>	
6	<p><b>Updates from Priority Partnerships:–</b></p> <p><b>I. Greening Hart Partnership</b> – VE advised that the Climate Change Panel was an internal facing group concentrating on what steps the council could take top reduce carbon emissions and to adapt council services, and the Climate Change Partnership was responsible for focussing on the SCS priorities. The planning policy teams at Hart, Rushmoor and Basingstoke &amp; Deane councils were working together looking at energy efficiency and carbon footprint reductions.</p> <p><b>II. Affordable Housing Partnership</b> – Martine Fullbrook (MF) gave a brief update on how the partnership was updating its action plan.</p> <p><b>III. Safer Hart Community Safety Partnership</b> – Cl Jackson (SJ) gave an overview of the outcomes of the Strategic Assessment of crime and the recent work of the CSP (attached). SJ also gave an update on the Streetwatch campaign and how it might be used in Hart. There was a brief discussion about recent anti-social behaviour in Fleet town centre and the approach taken by local partners. VE added information about three local issues – 1. 2 Accredited Community Support Officers (ACSO) were to be deployed to Hart and would work closely with the Community Support Officers for Hart; 2. The council was currently working on a partnership project with Rushmoor with a view to upgrading the CCTV services across the two districts; 3. The recently implemented regulations regarding the Scrutiny of Crime &amp; Disorder would see the hart Overview &amp; Scrutiny Panel hold it’s first review on 16<sup>th</sup> March 2010 at 7.00pm. Partners were welcome to attend and discuss issues.</p> <p><b>IV. A Beacon of Good Health</b> – The Health Board was working on three issues – 1. Health Strategy for Hart with a view to provision of a draft strategy by March 2010, consultation during July and finally adoption of the strategy in October/November 2010; 2. Older People’s Wellbeing Strategy for Hart – event to be held on 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2010 @ The Church on the Heath, Elvetham; and 3. the provision of NHS dentistry in the district (SCS priority) – the PCT had identified Hart as an area for fast-tracking provision and it was likely that this would result in additional capacity of some 3 – 4,000 NHS clients within the district. Cllr Susan Band added a comment about the Healthy Workplace Awards due to take place on 25<sup>th</sup> January.</p> <p><b>V. Economic Prosperity Group</b> – Tim Colman (TC) advised that the group had been unable to meet due, in the main, to the recent weather. A recent SEEDA document had stated that the economy was improving and that the level of unemployment was reducing. TC advised that he did not agree with this assessment since he was aware that the latest unemployment figures did not include unemployed executives who had not registered via the Job Centre Plus scheme. TC advised that he felt it would be a further 10 – 12 months before the situation stabilised, and that the group were due to meet</p>	

	<p>in early February.</p> <p><b>VI. A Sustainable and Accessible Transport System – see above.</b></p> <p><b>VII. Children &amp; Young People’s Partnership –</b> Lesley Trusler (LT) gave a brief update on the work of the CYPP. She also advised that the preferred structure for the Hart CYPP had been identified and that work would now commence on setting the new structure up and engaging with partners.</p>

Bill Flood informed the meeting of some of the initiatives that Sentinel had been working on and the ExtraCare scheme.</li> </ul>
